It focuses on the intentional selection of resources and pedagogical practices designed to foster expressive and receptive language and pre-writing and pre-reading skills.</p> <p>This unit applies to early childhood educators in, or seeking, leadership roles in long day care, family day care, in home care and out of school hours care settings.</p>
