Qualification Review - An Overview



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Consultation process

The *HLT47815 Certificate IV in Optical Dispensing* underwent a comprehensive review to ensure it continues to meet evolving industry requirements and workforce needs.

This review was informed by extensive consultation with industry stakeholders, employers, professional associations, registered training organisations, and subject matter experts.

Consultations were conducted between Monday 4 November 2024 and Friday 10 January 2025 using a mix of workshops, surveys, site visits, email submissions and meetings with subject matter experts (SMEs).

10 consultation workshops : 7 face-to-face and 3 online

5 site visits

3 technical committee meetings including 1 full day online workshop

HLT47825 Certificate IV in Optical Dispensing

Total number of units = 12

- 9 core units
- 3 elective units consisting of:
 - at least 2 units from the electives listed in the elective bank
 - remaining 1 unit from the electives listed in the elective bank or from any currently endorsed Training Package or accredited course.

HLTSS00086 Optical Assistant Skill Set

- Provides learners with practical, foundational knowledge that supports workplace readiness while also offering a stepping-stone into further formal training, such as the Certificate IV in Optical Dispensing.
- This targeted skill set supports the development of a more capable and confident entry-level workforce, better meeting the immediate needs of industry and improving the client service experience across optical settings.

HLTSS00087 Edging and Fitting Skill Set

- This skill set focuses on the specialist skills and knowledge required to accurately edge and fit optical lenses and appliances in line with Australian/New Zealand standards.
- Designed for qualified optical dispensers, laboratory assistants, and technicians looking to expand or refine their technical expertise, the *HLTSS00087 Edging and Fitting Skill Set* serves as a dedicated upskilling pathway.

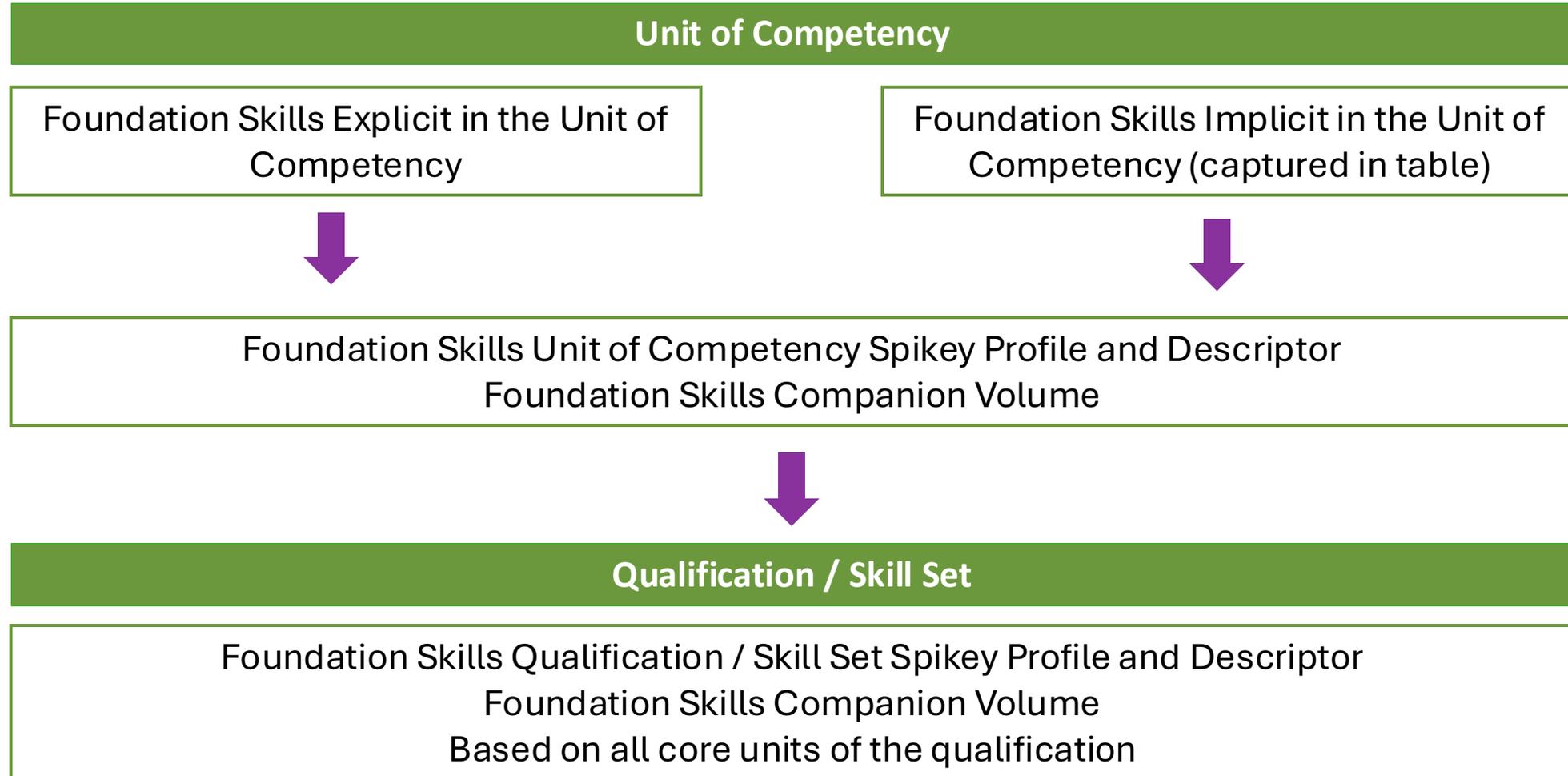

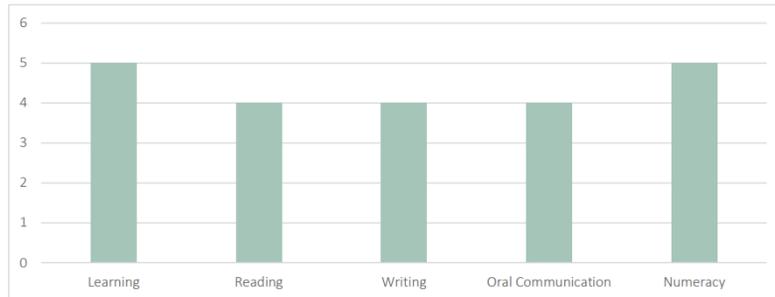
HLT47825 Certificate IV in Optical Dispensing

This qualification reflects the role of optical dispensers who dispense and supply optical appliances as prescribed by optometrists and ophthalmologists in accordance with Commonwealth and State/Territory legislation, Australian/New Zealand standards and industry codes of practice.

Optical dispensers practise in a range of environments including optical dispensaries, optometric practices and laboratories. They may be self-employed or employed by another optical dispenser, an optometrist, a major optical dispensing organisation or other retailer.

ACSF core skills profile

The core skills profile shows the ACSF level required to demonstrate the performance outcomes of this qualification.

Core units of competency

- These are mandatory for all students completing *HLT47825 Certificate IV in Optical Dispensing*.
 - The ACSF levels reflect core language, literacy, numeracy, and learning skills required for each unit.
 - Numeracy levels increase in technical dispensing units due to measurements, calculations, and precision work.

HLTOPD009 Dispense atypical and complex prescriptions

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to evaluate client needs, take measurements and make calculations to facilitate effective dispensing for atypical prescriptions, including for low vision clients, high myopia and complex situations.

This unit applies to optical dispensers who work according to prescriptions provided by optometrists and ophthalmologists.

ACSF core skills profile



Summary of key ACSF skills

Learning skills to follow legal, ethical and organisational procedures; understand features of different types of lenses including those for atypical prescriptions.

Reading skills to interpret organisational procedures; interpret health fund rebate requirements.

Writing skills to complete client records.

Oral Communication skills to interact with clients to identify optical appliance needs; explain benefits of optical appliances; address client concerns; provide advice on appliance maintenance.

Numeracy skills to take and record client measurements; use optical measuring equipment; make adjustments for optimal fit; transpose optical prescriptions; carry out optical calculations for complex optical prescriptions; process financial transactions and rebates.

Summary of digital capability skills using DigComp 2.2

Digital Capability skills to use digital technology for taking complex optical measurements, including digital lensometer and pupillometer; use digital tools and software to manipulate, organise, store and retrieve data information in established workplace systems; select, share information and interact using a variety of digital technologies; follow privacy protection guidelines to protect staff and client details; use workplace digital tools and systems independently and effectively.

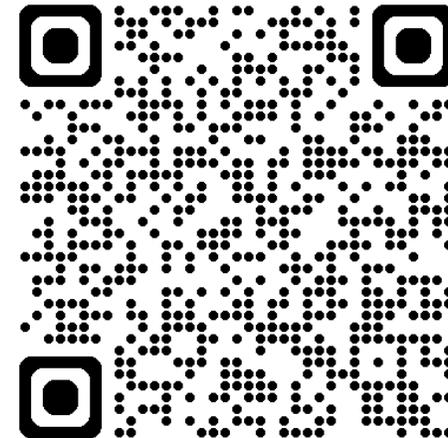
